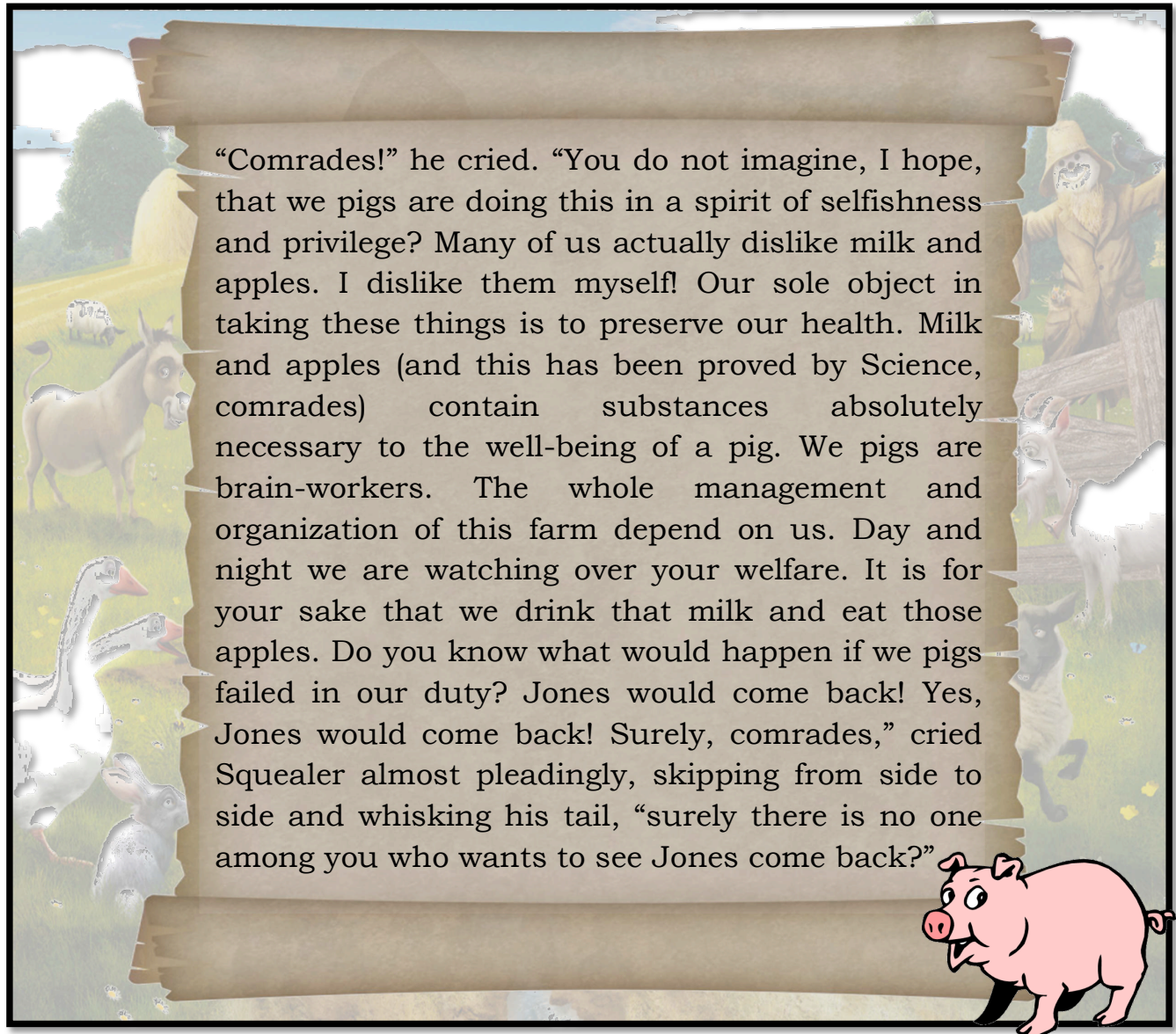


Persuasive language being used as Propaganda

Propaganda is when information – usually biased information – is used to promote a political cause or point of view.

This is clear in the novel *Animal Farm* by George Orwell. He shows how those who can use language persuasively, can get away with almost anything. The following extract is from the novel, just after the pigs have stolen the milk and apples. The main propagandist, Squealer, is trying to cover up the pigs' theft using the power of persuasive language.

- 5) Star any example of when Squealer is 'selective' with his information.
